SPECIAL EVENT NOV. 10th—Remembrance Day, 2018, marks the 100th anniversary of the end of the First World War (1914-1918). In honour of this milestone, Kamloops Museum & Archives (KMA) and the Kamloops Chinese Cultural Association will be hosting a special event at the Kamloops Cenotaph in Memorial Hill Park from 11:00 am to 12:00 pm on Saturday, November 10, 2018.

The presenters will discuss the history of the Kamloops Cenotaph and Cairn, including its 2016 restoration, as well as the story of Frederick Lee, a Rocky Mountain Ranger of the 172nd Battalion who fought and died in a pivotal WW1 battle, the Battle of Hill 70. Memorial Hill Park is located at 174-300 Battle Street. People of all ages are welcome.

The annual North Shore Photographic Challenge will be held on Saturday, March 2, 2019 at the Kay Meek Centre in West Vancouver. This is a live event that you can attend and maybe come home with a door prize or a CAPA medal if you've entered as an individual.

The Challenge was opened to Individuals a few years ago. The combination of Club and individual submissions has proven to be a success. The organizers are keen to repeat the format this year. Individual photographers as well as CAPA-affiliated clubs can submit images. KPAC is an affiliated CAPA Club but is giving the 2019 North Shore Photographic Challenge a pass for 2019. As an Individual you may submit up to 3 images. Clubs compete for the North Shore Challenge trophy. Each club may submit a maximum of 6 images.

Club and individual entries will be randomly mixed in the Challenge competition. Challenge judges will score each image out of a maximum of 27 points, as in previous years.
